Sarasota - The abduction and murder of 11 year old Carlie Brucia reminded the Sarasota community of how real the threat of danger is. On Saturday, 59 children were fingerprinted as part of the ID ME NOW program.

Using state of the art technology, CPEA provides parents with digital fingerprint scans and photos of their children. The parents keep the information on file to share with law enforcement in case their child is missing.
